Chapter 470, Soil Movement
Fee Schedule Per Application

I. Application fees.

- A. Single-family individual lots at \$0.20 per cubic yard (minimum fee of \$300).
- B. All other soil movement permit applications at \$0.20 per cubic yard for the first 3,000 cubic yards to be moved (minimum fee of \$300); \$0.15 per cubic yard from 3,001 to 5,000 cubic yards; \$0.10 per cubic yard for 5,001 cubic yards and over.

II. Review fees.

All requests for review of soil movement applications after the second submission shall be accompanied by a check for \$60.

As a minimum, submission must include:

- o Completed Application.
- o Topographic Plan of entire site when over 200 Cubic Yards *or* for in-ground swimming pools.
- o Soil quantity computations.
- o Plot Plan Review fee, if new or reconstructed dwelling is proposed.
- o Building or structural plans of any new construction causing soil movement.
- o Design computations for all retaining walls over 5 ft. high.
- o The Borough Engineer may require topographic plans for any application, if deemed necessary, due to existing topographic conditions or the nature of work proposed.

In-ground swimming pools:

Topographic plans are required for ALL in-ground swimming pools.

Stormwater Management:

All projects which create over 500SF of additional impervious surfaces must include on-site seepage pits or other detention type devices. Seepage pits may be required for other new construction regardless of area of impervious surfaces created if deemed necessary by the Borough Engineer.
